## To the examining Doctor

Dear Doctor,

SVP is a small voluntary organisation which depends on volunteers finding much of their own finance for our work. We are very grateful to those doctors who are able to waive or reduce their fee (which is payable by the volunteer) for this examination and advice. A detailed physical examination is not looked for but we do need to know that the volunteer is healthy and fit for this work.

SVP volunteers will be working mostly indoors in northern Sudan where temperatures may be up to 45°C and conditions occasionally dusty.

Malaria prophylaxis with Lariam has had undesirable side effects with some of our volunteers and the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine\* has now dis-recommended Proguanil and Chloroquine: they suggest Malarone or Doxycycline. Doxycycline (100mg daily) is reasonably cheap in Sudan while Malarone is not available. Following diagnosis, treatment available in Sudan is by ACT (Artemisinin Combined Therapy), widely available.

Please make any comment on the form that you think may be relevant. We need to know of previous infections such as HIV and Hepatitis C and how they have been treated. All information you give will be treated in confidence.
